[How does law protect in war?](#) (the "Online Casebook") is an academic platform adapted from the original reference Casebook authored by [Marco Sassòli](#), [Antoine Bouvier](#) and [Anne Quintin](#), and published by the ICRC. It is intended to support teaching of international humanitarian law (IHL) in universities in an interactive way, and based on contemporary practice. [The Law](#) section features a general outline presenting IHL in 15 chapters. It contains comprehensive bibliographic resources and links each theme to a range of related case studies and documents. [The Practice](#) section comprises over 450 case studies and documents regrouped either by theme or by region, or by type of document. They allow practice-oriented learning of IHL rules and interactive discussions through series of questions. The [Pedagogical Resources](#) section provides useful advice on how to teach IHL, as well as 29 model course outlines and other useful resources. The [A to Z](#) section presents over 400 notions linked to IHL, their legal sources, the case studies where they are addressed, as well as bibliographic resources to delve further into those notions. A [search engine](#) allows users to find rapidly the relevant pedagogical material they need on the platform. In 2014, a first version of the online platform was launched.
