In an international armed conflict ^[1], the Power holding wounded, sick ^[2] and shipwrecked ^[3] members of the armed forces ^[4], medical ^[5] and religious personnel ^[6], persons protected under GCIV or prisoners of war ^[7] belonging to the adverse party.
